CALL FOR PAPERS

Kenya School of Law is a public institution initially set up under the Council of Legal Education Act but re-established under the Kenya School of Law Act, No. 26 of 2012. The mandate of the School is to be a public legal education provider responsible for the provision of professional legal training as an agent of the Government. The School is responsible for training of lawyers for entry into the legal profession; ensuring continuing professional development for all cadres of the legal profession; providing para-legal training; providing other specialized training in the legal sector; developing curricular, and training manuals; conducting examinations, conferring academic awards; and undertaking projects, research and consultancies.

The School now calls for expression of interest from legal scholars, practitioners, judicial officers, in-house lawyers, students, regulatory institutions, policymakers, curricula development experts, other social scientists and professionals in public and private sector organizations to submit scholarly, well-researched papers for discussion at a symposium scheduled for February 2014. The theme is: **Emerging Issues in Legal Education in East Africa** and papers should cover the following sub-themes:

Abstracts and draft papers should:

- Refer to recent socio-economic, regulatory, legal and policy developments in Kenya or East Africa
- Conform to academic citation standards
- Utilise MS Word format, Font: Times New Roman 12, Line Spacing 1.5

Submissions should include the author's full names, contacts, a declaration of originality and a statement that the author consents to the publication of the work. Authors should indicate whether the paper has been submitted for publication or published elsewhere and note that acceptance of an abstract or interim draft shall not automatically result in publication of the paper.
