APPLICATION FOR PRE-BAR EXAMINATION – JANUARY 2027

It is hereby notified to the public that the Kenya School of Law will conduct the **Pre-Bar Examination in January 2027** for applicants seeking admission to the **Advocates Training Programme (ATP) for the 2027/2028 Academic Year**.

The Pre-Bar Examination is a pre-condition for admission to the ATP for applicants who fall under the following category:

A person who holds a Bachelor of Laws Degree (LL.B.) from a recognised university and attained a minimum grade of C- (Minus) in English and a minimum aggregate grade of C- (Minus) in the Kenya Certificate of Secondary Education (KCSE), or its equivalent.

NB: All applicants must have passed, as part of their Bachelor of Laws Degree (LL.B.) course units, the mandatory sixteen (16) core subjects stipulated in the Second Schedule to the Legal Education Act, Cap. 16B.

1. DATE, VENUE AND EXAMINATION STRUCTURE

The Pre-Bar Examination will be held from **Monday, 11 January 2027 to Wednesday, 13 January 2027** at the **Kenya School of Law, Karen Campus, Lang'ata South Road, Karen**.

The examination will test applicants' mastery of basic legal techniques, legal writing and substantive legal principles at degree-subject level. It will also assess applicants' proficiency in the English language.

2. APPLICATION AND EXAMINATION FEES

Application forms are available from the **Academic Services Office, Kenya School of Law**, upon payment of the following non-refundable fees:

- **Application fee:** Kshs. 2,000.00
- **Examination fee:** Kshs. 5,000.00 per subject

NB: Personal cheques and cash payments shall not be accepted by the School.

3. DOCUMENTS TO ACCOMPANY THE APPLICATION

The completed application form must be submitted together with:

- a) A copy of the applicant's LL.B. degree certificate or proof of eligibility for conferment;
- b) Copies of academic transcripts for the four (4) academic years.

NB: Provisional transcripts shall only be accepted if they show proof of eligibility for conferment of the LL.B. degree;

- c) A copy of the secondary school certificate(s);
- d) A copy of the national identity card or valid passport;
- e) Two (2) passport-size colour photographs;
- f) A copy of the payment receipt issued by the Kenya School of Law;
- g) A copy of the CLE clearance letter for applicants with LL.B. degrees from foreign universities;
- h) A letter of equation from the Kenya National Qualifications Authority (KNQA) for secondary school qualifications not offered by KNEC; and
- i) A copy of the admission letter to the LL.B. programme.
